FRIDAY, OCTOBER 29 -

Depart Denver on Delta Airlines flight #734 nonstop to New York (JFK), leaving at 10:45AM and arriving at 5:15PM. Connect with Delta flight #268 to Tel Aviv, leaving at 7:35PM.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 30 - TIBERIAS (B,D)

Upon arrival in Tel Aviv at 12:15PM, you will be met by a Ya'lla Tours USA representative and transferred to your hotel for dinner and overnight. MAAGAN HOLIDAY VILLAGE is a 3-star resort located on the waterfront of the Sea of Galilee.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 31 - TIBERIAS (B,D)

Take a private boat on the Sea of Galilee to see the Genosar Boat. This 1st-century fishing boat was discovered in 1986 when the lake receded to record low levels. Continue to Capernaum where Jesus preached, and his disciples, Peter and Andrew, made their homes. Then, travel up the Mount of the Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount and the Miracle of the Fishes. Visit the contemporary church at Tabga which celebrates the Miracle of the Multiplication. Note the mosaic floor from a Byzantine-era church, and the section in front of the ancient altar depicting two fish and a basket filled with loaves of bread. Then drive to Cana and continue to Nazareth where our Lord spent most of his life. Visit the Church of the Annunciation and St. Joseph's Grotto. End the day with a visit to the Nazareth Village for a first-hand experience of the way of life in the ancient Galilee. Return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 01 - TIBERIAS (B,D)

Take a taxi to the top of Mt. Tabor and visit the Church of the Transfiguration. Enjoy an outstanding view of the Jezreel Valley, where the battle of Deborah and the Midianites took place. At Tzipori, see the ruins of a Galilean village. Continue to Megiddo, the "Hill of Battles," where archaeologists have uncovered 20 civilizations built one upon another. King Solomon built his vast stables here and good King Josiah died in battle. End the day at Mt. Arbel; walk to the top of the mountain for outstanding views of the Sea of Galilee. Return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 02 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

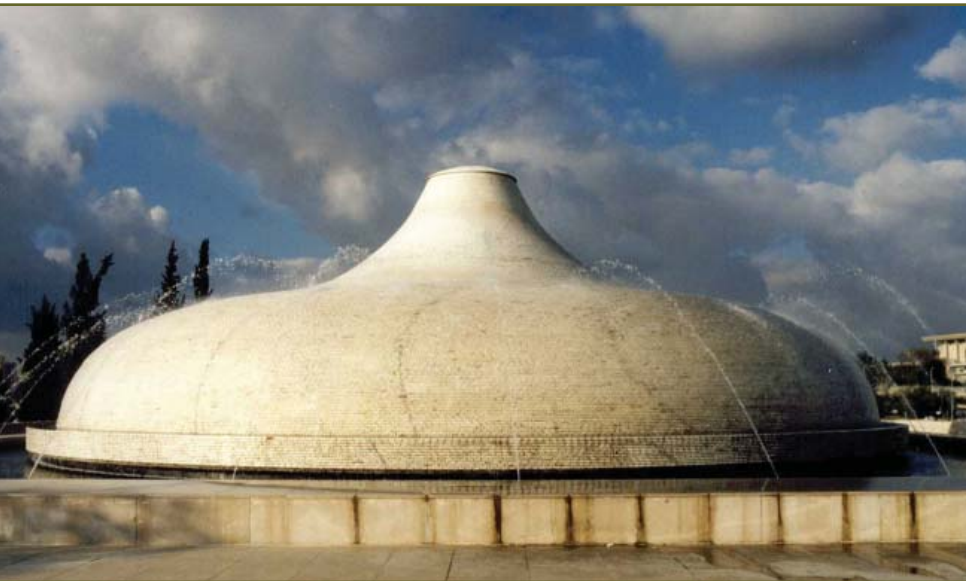
Cross the Galilee to the ancient town by the Mediterranean, Akko. Visit the Knights' Halls, beautiful remains of the Crusade period. Continue to Mt. Carmel and the Carmelite Monastery of Muhraka at the site where Elijah defeated the priests of Ba'al. On to Caesarea, a large port city built by Herod the Great to honor Roman Caesar Augustus. Herod built a port in the bay and erected all the cultural institutions found in every great Greco-Roman city - a theater, a hippodrome, and a luxurious bathhouse. In order to supply water to the city's ever-growing population, he built an aqueduct system stretching from the springs of Mt. Carmel to Caesarea. Part of this system is still visible today. The book of Acts refers repeatedly to Caesarea as the city Peter visited (Acts 10). Then climb the Judean Hills to the most beautiful city in the world, Jerusalem, for dinner and overnight. REGENCY is a beautiful 4.5-star hotel with a great view of Jerusalem from Mt. Scopus, only 10 minutes away from the Old City and downtown Jerusalem. www.regency.co.il

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 03 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Visit the House of Chiaphas, chief priest of the Jews, where Jesus was held prior to his trial. Continue to the City of David and see the excavations that reveal the earliest days of Jerusalem, dating back to King David. Weather permitting, walk Hezekiah's Tunnel. Continue to Mt. Zion and visit David's Tomb and the Last Supper Room. Walk to the Old City via the Zion Gate, used by the Israel Defense Forces in 1967 to enter and capture the Old City. Stones surrounding the gate are still pockmarked by weapons fire. See the Burnt House and the Herodian Quarter, vivid reminders of the Roman conquest and destruction of the Temple in 70 AD. Then visit the Temple Institute and see how some Jews are preparing for the construction of the Third Temple. Walk down to the Western Wall, the only visible remains of the Second Temple and the holiest site in Judaism. See the Temple Steps, the original steps leading to the Temple's Entrance to the Court of the Israelites. At the Davidson Center, view a multi-media presentation about Jerusalem in the days of Jesus. Then walk through the Western Wall Tunnel, huge arched spaces just north of the Western Wall. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

**THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 04 - JERUSALEM (B,D)**

Visit the Israel Museum and the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibition at the Shrine of the Book. Then see the model of the city as it was in the days of Jesus. Continue to Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial. A local Cantor will join us for a short memorial service there. Continue to Ein Karem and the Church of St. John the Baptist. Climb to the Church of the Visitation and view the different versions of the Magnificat. End the day at the Garden Tomb. Many Protestant denominations hold the Garden Tomb to be the location of Jesus' burial and Resurrection. We will have time for prayer and meditation in this peaceful spot. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 05 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive to the Mount of Olives for an awe inspiring, panoramic view of Jerusalem. Walk down to one of the newest churches in Jerusalem, Dominus Flevit. During construction in 1955, archaeologists uncovered artifacts dating back to the Canaanite period as well as tombs from both the Second Temple and Byzantine eras. The Garden of Gethsemane lies at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Today it appears as it did 20 centuries ago and within it are some of the world's oldest olive trees. It was here that, on His last night, Jesus spent the most sorrowful hour of His passion. Originally built in 379, the Church of Gethsemane was rebuilt in 1919–1924. Long considered one of the most beautiful in Jerusalem, it is called the Church of All Nations because 16 nations contributed to its construction. Enter the Christian Quarter of the Old City through the Lion Gate. Here is the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the blind man and St. Anne Church with extraordinary acoustics. Walk the Way of the Cross, the Via Dolorosa, to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In 325, Helen, Constantine's mother, first requisitioned the area for a church. This 4th-century church was largely destroyed by the Turks in 1009 and partially restored in 1048. The impressive stone decorations adorning the facade date from Crusader times. Stay in the Old City for some shopping. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 06 - AMMAN (B,D)

Transfer from Jerusalem to the Allenby Bridge and cross to Jordan. We will meet our Jordanian guide and drive north to Umm Qais, the Biblical Gadara. Continue to Ajloun Nature Reserve and then to the 12th-century Saracen Castle built by one of Saladin's lieutenants in the campaign against the Crusaders. This is a beautiful area of Mediterranean woodland hills and forests of oak, pistachio, and pine trees. Continue to one of the best preserved examples of Roman civilization in the world, the city of Jerash, located in the fertile heights of Gilead. Stroll the stately colonnaded streets past the theater, the baths, the hill top temple and the triumphal arch. Continue to Amman for dinner and overnight. GENEVA is a 4-star, family owned hotel in Amman. www.genevahotel-amman.com

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 07 - PETRA (B,D)

After breakfast, begin a city tour of Amman. Jordan's capital is known as the "White City" because of the white sandstone used in the buildings. The atmosphere of Amman offers a contrast between oriental and cosmopolitan. Stop briefly for coffee at a café overlooking the Temple of Hercules and the Citadel. Visit the Roman Theater of Amman and the castle (Citadel). Drive south and visit Bethany beyond the Jordan where John the Baptist preached and baptized and quite possibly the baptism site of Jesus (recent excavations have uncovered baptismal pools). It is also the place from which Elijah ascended to heaven in a chariot of fire. Continue to Mt. Nebo, the traditional site of the tomb of Moses overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. The ancient church there houses some lovely 6th-century mosaics. Continue to the mosaic-rich holy city of Madaba. Visit St. George Cathedral. The cathedral's 6th-century mosaic floor contains the earliest surviving map of the Holy Land. On to Petra for dinner and overnight. BEIT ZAMAN is a 4-star hotel with 129 comfortable guest rooms, all of which are air-conditioned, furnished and decorated with refinement in 19th-century style. www.jordantourismresorts.com



MONDAY, NOVEMBER 08 - PETRA

(B,D)

Today tour the city of Petra. Travel on horseback to the siq (canyon), and then on foot to Petra. Known as *Sela Edom* or Red Rock City, Petra was the capital of the Nabateans from the 3rd century BC to the 2nd century AD. Petra's most elegant monument, *El Khazneh* (the Treasury) comes dramatically into view as you emerge from the siq. Beyond the Treasury an entire city is carved into the canyon walls. Other outstanding structures include The Monastery and Urn Tomb. Wander through the field of tombs and obelisks to *Al Madhbah* (the Altar). From this point you can view the whole of the rock city. The most adventurous will be invited to hike up to the spiritual High Place, site of the sacrificial altar and offering a spectacular view of the ancient city and surroundings. Dinner tonight will be at Petra Kitchen where you will learn how to cook Jordanian food and then dine on your own creations. Return to the hotel for overnight.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 09 - CAIRO

(B,L)

Depart Petra and drive south to Wadi Rum. Take a short 4X4 vehicle ride into the oasis with its awesome moon-like landscape. The film *Lawrence of Arabia* was shot here. Enjoy a Bedouin lunch with the locals, in the tradition of the Patriarchs. Then, return to Amman Queen Alia Airport for your Egypt Air flight #702 to Cairo, leaving at 7:35PM and arriving at 9:05PM. In Cairo, you will be met by a Ya'lla Tours representative and transferred to your hotel for overnight. GRAND PYRAMIDS HOTEL is a 4-star property located near the Pyramids and only minutes from downtown Cairo. This resort hotel is beautifully set in landscaped gardens with breathtaking views of the Giza Pyramids. www.grandpyramidshotel.com

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 10 - CAIRO

(B,L)

Your private Egyptologist / tour guide and driver will pick you up at 8:30AM to start your full day tour. Drive to Giza and visit the Pyramids. See the Great Pyramid, a royal burial chamber, the Valley Temple, and the Sphinx. Continue to Memphis, capital of the Pharaohs during the Old Kingdom. Visit the recumbent

statue of Ramesses II and the 80-ton Alabaster Sphinx. Lunch en route. Continue to Sakara to see the prototype of the pyramids, the Step Pyramid, built for the 3rd-Dynasty Pharaoh Djoser by the exalted architect Imhotep. Continuing south, visit the Pyramid of Dahshour. Seneferu, father of Cheops, built this pyramid, also known as the Red Pyramid, approximately 4,600 years ago. Many scholars consider it to be more glorious than the Great Pyramid of Cheops. Return to Cairo and your hotel for overnight.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 11 - CAIRO - HOME

(B,L,D)

Visit the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities. Among other fascinating exhibits, see the treasures of the Tomb of Tutankhamen. Walk back in time in Old Cairo, visiting the Old Coptic Church and the Ben Ezra Synagogue. Lunch en route. Continue to the Mohamad Ali Mosque and the streets of Khan el Khalili Bazaar. Enjoy a farewell dinner at a typical Egyptian restaurant.

At 8:00PM, you will be transferred to the airport for your departure on Delta Airlines flight #85 nonstop to New York, leaving at 11:55PM.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 12 -

Arrive New York at 5:05AM. After clearing U.S. Customs and Immigration, connect to Delta Airlines flight #1103 nonstop to Salt Lake City, departing at 6:40AM and arriving at 10:05AM. Connect to Delta Airlines flight #4484 nonstop to Denver, leaving at 11:05AM and arriving at 12:40PM.
