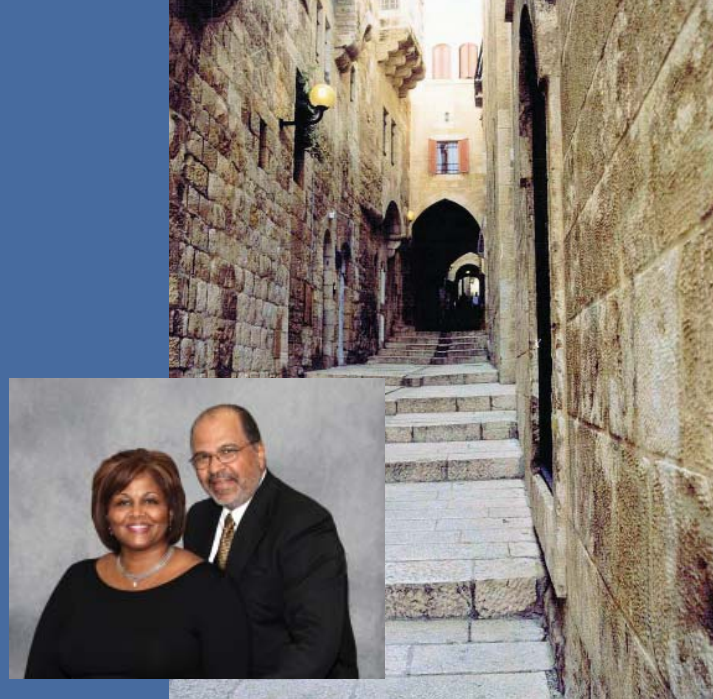


Journey of Faith to the Bible Land

SUNDAY, MARCH 20 -

Depart Portland with Delta Airlines flight #1891 nonstop to Atlanta, leaving at 11:55AM and arriving at 7:31PM. Connect with Delta Airlines flight #152 nonstop to Tel Aviv, leaving at 10:30PM.

MONDAY, MARCH 21 - TIBERIAS (D)

Upon arrival at Tel Aviv Ben Gurion Airport at 4:20PM, you will be met by a Ya'lla Tours USA representative and transferred to your hotel for dinner and overnight. LEONARDO PLAZA TIBERIAS is a 5-star property located on the Promenade, on the shore of the historic Sea of Galilee.

TUESDAY, MARCH 22 - TIBERIAS (B,D)

Drive to the ruins of Caesarea, a large port city built by Herod the Great to honor Roman Caesar Augustus. Herod built a port in the bay and erected all the cultural institutions found in every great Greco-Roman city - a theater, a hippodrome, and a luxurious bathhouse. In order to supply water to the city's ever-growing population, he built an aqueduct system stretching from the springs of Mt. Carmel to Caesarea. Part of this system is still visible today. The book of Acts refers repeatedly to Caesarea as the city Peter visited (Acts 10). We continue our pilgrimage to Mt. Carmel and the Carmelite Monastery of Muhraka, the site where God caused Elijah to defeat the priests of Ba'al. Then, visit Megiddo, the "Hill of Battles," where archaeologists have uncovered 20 civilizations built one upon another. At this site, King Solomon built his vast stables and good King Josiah died in battle.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 23 - TIBERIAS (B,L,D)

Take a taxi to the top of Mt. Tabor and visit the Church of the Transfiguration. Enjoy an outstanding view of the Jezreel Valley where the battle of Deborah and the Midianites took place.

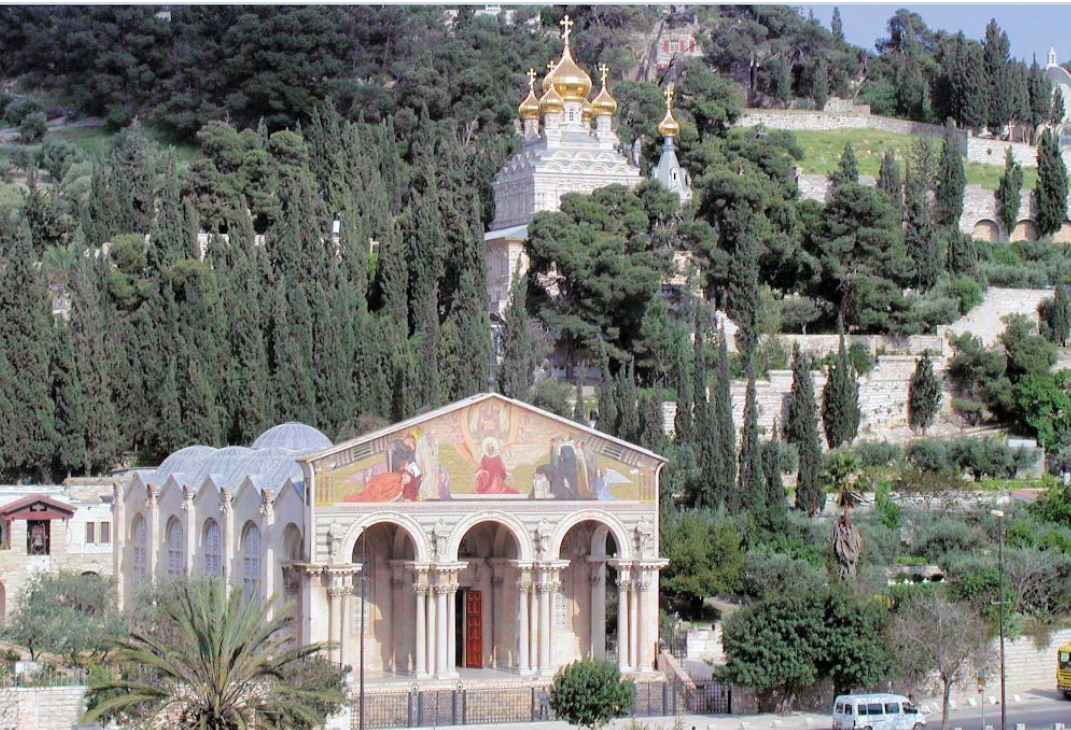
Continue to Tzipori to see the spectacular ruins of a Galilean Village from the days of Jesus. Then visit the Nazareth Village and experience first hand the way of life in the Galilee in the days of Jesus. Enjoy a biblical style lunch. Continue to Nazareth, home to the largest Arab population in Israel. Visit the Church of the Annunciation and St. Joseph's Grotto. Depart Nazareth and stop in Cana, the site of Jesus' first miracle, converting the water into wine at the wedding. Visit the Church of the Wedding.

THURSDAY, MARCH 24 - TIBERIAS (B,L,D)

Take a private boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to see the 2,000 year old Genosar Boat discovered in 1986. Continue to Peter's House in Capernaum which reveals the domestic life of a New Testament fisherman. Drive to the Mount of the Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount and the Miracle of the Fishes. Enjoy a St. Peter's Fish lunch at Kibbutz Hagoshrim. Then walk to a unique location on the River Jordan where we will remember our own baptism. Next, drive to the Upper Galilee to Baniyas (Caesarea Philippi) to see the source of the Jordan River and the site of Peter's confession "...you are the Christ" (Matt. 16:18).

FRIDAY, MARCH 25 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive to Beth Shean and visit the ruins of one of Israel's most ancient cities. In its 7,000 year history the Egyptian, Roman and Byzantine empires have laid claim to the site, attracted by abundant water, fertile soil and the situation at an important east-west crossroads. Continue to Mt. Gilboa and Harod Spring, where Gideon chose his 300 brave men. Then climb the Judean Hills to the most beautiful city in the world, JERUSALEM, for a Shabbat, dinner and overnight. DAN PANORAMA is a moderate 4.5 star hotel located within easy walking distance of the Old City. www.danhotels.com



SUNDAY, MARCH 27 - JERUSALEM
(B,D)

Depart Jerusalem and drive east to Masada, a natural fortress with majestic ruins overlooking the Dead Sea. Take a cable car to the top of the plateau for a tour. Jewish zealots held the rock against the unrelenting 10th Roman legion until 72 AD, when a monumental siege, using an astounding attack ramp, conquered the fortress. The camps and other fortifications that encircle the mesa constitute the most complete Roman siege works to have survived to the present day. Descend by cable car and drive to the Dead Sea for a float in the water, a unique and delightful (and therapeutic!) experience you will never forget. See Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. Return to Jerusalem.

SATURDAY, MARCH 26 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive 6 miles south to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, the oldest church in the holy land still in use. Construction began in the year 326, based on the local tradition that Jesus was born in a cave at the edge of the village. Return to Jerusalem and the Mount of Olives for an awe inspiring, panoramic view of Jerusalem. Walk down the Mount of Olives to the site of Jesus' Agony. Visit the Church of Pater Noster, located on the hill where Jesus was inspired with the Our Father prayer. The walls of the church are covered with the prayer written in over 85 languages. Walk to one of the newest churches in Jerusalem, Dominus Flevit, "Jesus Wept." During construction in 1955, archaeologists uncovered artifacts dating back to the Canaanite period as well as tombs from both the Second Temple and Byzantine eras. The Garden of Gethsemane lies at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Today it appears much as it did 20 centuries ago and contains some of the world's oldest olive trees. The garden was a spot favored by Jesus for meditation and prayer. Originally built in 379, the Church of Gethsemane was rebuilt in 1919 – 1924. Long considered one of the most beautiful in Jerusalem, it was called the Church of All Nations because 16 nations contributed to its construction. Then drive to the Old City and pass through Stephen's Gate into the Christian Quarter. See the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the blind man and St. Anne's Church with amazing acoustics. Walk the Way of the Cross, the Via Dolorosa, to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In 325, Constantine's mother Helen first requisitioned the area for a church. This 4th-century church was largely destroyed by the Turks in 1009 and partially restored in 1048. The impressive stone decorations adorning the facade date from Crusader times. In its current form, the church preserves the Crusader structure and is shared by two major Christian denominations, the Greek Orthodox and the Roman Catholic. The church enshrines a tomb that some traditions hold to be the place of Jesus' burial and resurrection.



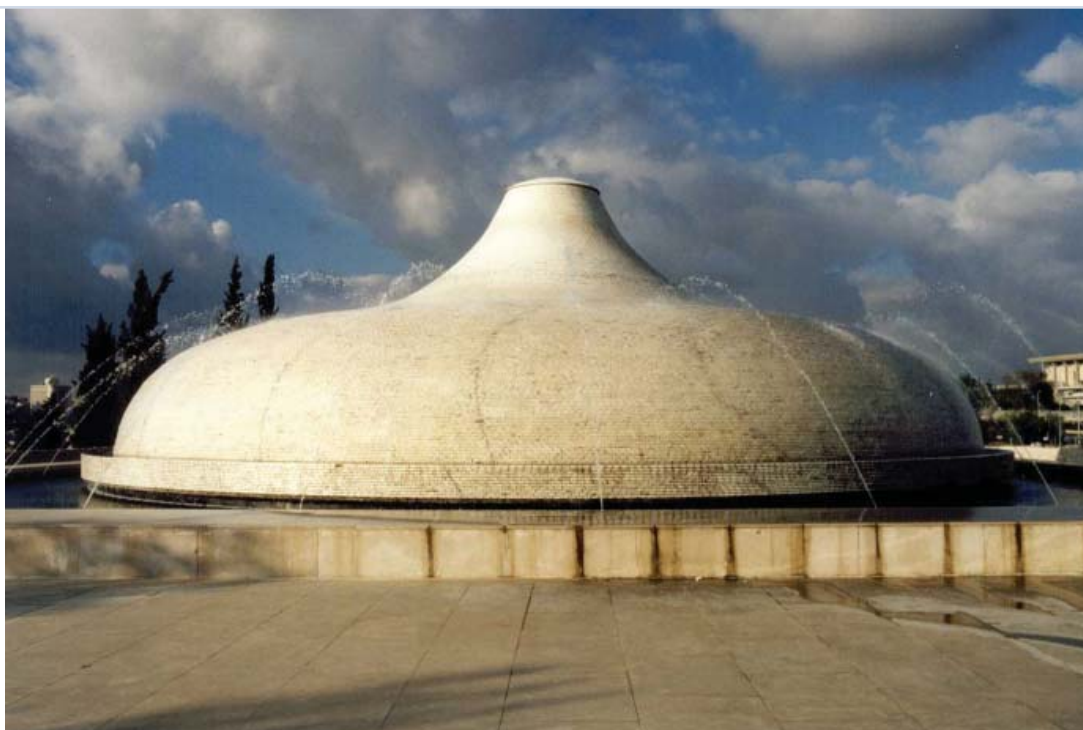
Church of the Nativity, Bethlehem

MONDAY, MARCH 28 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Visit the House of Chiaphas, where Jesus was held prior to his trial. Then visit the City of David, the oldest part of Jerusalem. Weather permitting, walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel. At Mt. Zion, see David's Tomb and the Last Supper Room. Enter the Jewish quarter of the Old City through the Zion Gate. Walk down to the Western Wall, the holiest site in Judaism and the only visible remains of the Second Temple, where Jesus walked and taught. See the Temple Steps, the original steps leading to the Temple's entrance. At Davidson Center, watch the multimedia presentation about Jerusalem in the days of Jesus. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel, huge arched spaces just north of the Western Wall.

TUESDAY, MARCH 29 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Visit Neot Kedumim. This Biblical Landscape Reserve recreates the physical setting of the Bible. Far more than a garden showing various biblical plants, Neot Kedumim embodies the power of the landscapes that helped shape the values of the Bible and provided a rich vocabulary for expressing them. The land that you are about to enter is not like the land of Egypt, where you sowed your seed and watered it with your foot (Deuteronomy 11:10). The foot-operated water wheel also appears in rabbinic literature as a wheel-of-fortune image: one day you're full, one day you're empty; one day you're up, one day you're down. If you're the one on the top, help the ones on the bottom, for tomorrow, the wheel will turn (Ruth Rabba 5, 9). From here we will make our way south to Beit Guvrin and participate in an archaeological dig. Get your hands dirty and perhaps find some ancient coins and pieces of pottery.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 30 - JERUSALEM (B,D)

Visit the Israel Museum and the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibition at the Shrine of the Book. Then see the model of the city as it was in the days of Jesus. Continue to Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial for a tour and a short memorial service. We will end our pilgrimage with a visit to the Garden Tomb. Many Protestant denominations hold the Garden Tomb to be the location of Jesus' Resurrection. Return to your hotel for a farewell dinner and time to relax until your departure.

You will be transferred to the airport around 7:30PM for your nonstop, Delta Airlines flight #153 to Atlanta, departing at 10:35PM.

THURSDAY, MARCH 31 -

Arrive Atlanta at 6:00AM. Clear U.S. Customs and Immigration and connect with Delta nonstop flight #1761 to Portland, leaving at 8:36AM and arriving at 11:11AM.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

PRICE:

- The price of the tour is: \$3,895 per person in a double room based on a minimum of 40 passengers. The price is guaranteed but if due to unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of Ya'lla Tours USA Inc. our suppliers increase the price, Ya'lla USA Inc. will adjust the price accordingly.
- Price of the airfare portion of the tour is subject to change until the air ticket is issued.
- Should a single traveler wish to share a room and Ya'lla Tours USA Inc. is unable to match him/her with a roommate, the single room supplement will apply.
- Should the number of participants, 90 days prior to departure, be lower than the published minimum number of participants to operate the tour, the price will be adjusted accordingly, or the tour will be canceled.

DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT POLICY:

- A deposit of \$750 is due upon registration.
- Final payment is due December 20, 2010.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUND:

- For cancellation before 12/20/2010, a \$300 per person administrative fee will apply.
- For cancellation 89-45 days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 50% of the cost of the tour will apply.
- For cancellation 44-15 days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 75% of the cost of the tour will apply.
- For cancellation 14 or fewer days prior to departure, a cancellation fee of 100% of the cost of the tour will apply.
- No refund will be paid for unused services such as: transfers, sight-seeing, meals, hotel entrance fees, etc.
- Travel insurance is nonrefundable.

PASSENGER RESPONSIBILITY:

Passenger has read the above terms and conditions and agrees to each of them. Passenger hereby warrants that he/she fully understand each of them. Specifically passenger understands that should he/she cancel their trip for any reason, passenger will be charged the cancellation fee set out above.

PASSPORT AND DOCUMENTATION:

Your passport must be valid for at least six months following your entry date to your travel destination.
